## The Terry Scholarship Fund

Established in 1999 by Mary Virginia Terry in honor of her beloved husband, C. Herman Terry, a Christian man whose dedication to higher education spanned his entire life.

Mr. Terry was born in Ray City, Georgia. Herman, as he was known by his friends, graduated from the University of Georgia. He spent most of his adult life in Jacksonville where he founded the Dependable Insurance Group of companies.

Mr. Terry was actively involved in civic and business affairs in Jacksonville and was a director or trustee of several institutions including Jacksonville University, the University of Georgia, First Union National Bank, Cummer Museum, the Jacksonville Symphony and many other organizations. In 1991 the University of Georgia College of Business was renamed in honor of the Terrys.

After Mr. Terry's death in 1998, Mary Virginia continued their community involvement and philanthropy as major supporters of education, children's charities, hospitals and cultural causes.

Mrs. Terry, a graduate of Valdosta State University, has served on the Board of Directors of Jacksonville University, Wolfson Children's Hospital, Ronald McDonald House, the Salvation Army, the Sulzbacher Center and the Women's Guild of the Jacksonville Symphony. Mary Virginia has been a long time member of Ortega United Methodist Church and was the leading supporter of the Capital Campaign for the Ortega Life Center.
