Faith and I want to thank you for our time away! We enjoyed our once-in-a-lifetime visit to Europe, and we certainly enjoyed spending the last week of our leave of absence with our new miracle baby granddaughter. It was a beautiful time with family and now we return refreshed and renewed to serve Christ and community with our Ortega Church family.

Most of our time in Europe was spent in Italy, which included one day in Florence – certainly not enough time. A highlight was our visit to the Accademia Gallery which hosts Michelangelo's famous statue of David. It is an amazing piece of art – the most famous statue in Florence and arguably in all the world. Michelangelo was commissioned to recount of the biblical battle between David and Goliath as told in the Old Testament Book of 1 Samuel. We all know the story...or do we? Prior to Michelangelo, all the artists and sculptors portrayed David **after** his triumph over a defeated Goliath. Michelangelo, for the first time ever, chooses to depict David **before** the battle. David stands ready yet seemingly relaxed. The slingshot over his shoulder is almost invisible, emphasizing that David's victory is not of sheer force. David's stance and facial expression transmit confidence and concentration – both needed for the battle about to unfold.

Chapter 17 shares this best-known biblical story – the story of David and Goliath – a memorable lesson on God's faithfulness even in the most impossible situations. This contest between men and nations and deities has embedded itself in the culture of every nation in the world. It is so well known that it has become the prevailing way of describing any conflict in which there is obvious disparity between the combatants.

In 1 Samuel 13:14 the youthful David is called "A man after God's own heart" – which means David puts God's honor, God's glory before all other considerations. David's later writing of Psalm 23 sheds light on David's daily walk with God which prepares him for the epic battle. The calm composed faith of David's reliance on God empowers him to conquer his enemies. David did not fight for himself alone but for the whole nation of God's people.

In far greater measure this and many other Bible accounts exemplifies in far higher measure the victories of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is the presence and the power that enables God's people to overcome. Jesus fights the foe Death and defeats death for all people. We are encouraged by Christ not to fear whatever foe might be come against us. May we boldly work to defeat sin whether it is in our own hearts or at work in the world. May we boldly pray and live to defeat whatever giant may be threatening us to the glory of God as we live our faith in the peace of Christ and through the presence and power of God's Holy Spirit – here with you now, and always, and forever.

Summer months are often a time when gifts to the church are overlooked, while December is often a time when pledges and contributions are fulfilled with year-end gifting.
