Thoughts and Prayers

We've all heard the words: "Our thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by"... [and you can fill in the blank with one of many recent tragedies: hurricanes, acts of war, horrific shootings, senseless tragedy, and the storms of life in your life]. Some say such statements have little meaning if not accompanied by meaningful action. So, should we stop sending our thoughts and prayers to grieving people?

I don't think so, but to their point, too often the cliché words "thoughts and prayers" are offered in place of meaningful action. Scripture is used to reinforce the point that thoughts and prayers without effective action are meaningless. James 2:14-16 encourages: What good is it if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing and you say, "Good-bye and have a good day; stay warm and eat well"—but then you don't give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do?

In Paul's second letter to the Thessalonian Church he boasts, *We can't help but thank God for you, because your faith is flourishing and your love for one another is growing abundantly. We proudly tell God's other churches about your endurance and faithfulness in all the persecutions and hardships you are suffering.* Then Paul offers this prayer: *We keep on praying for you, asking our God to enable you to live a life worthy of his call. May God give you the power to accomplish all the good things your faith prompts you to do.*

No matter how helpless we may feel when expressing empathy with someone who has suffered great loss, no matter that we know our words alone will often not suffice, sincere thoughts and prayers have merit, they have value. In prayer, our thoughts are elevated to the work of our ministry when they prompt us to see what's really happening – not from our point of view, but to see from the view of those who are affected by the tragedy - to see a Kingdom of God point of view. Our thoughts are our work of ministry when they lead us to consider if there's any concrete action we might do or in our supporting others in their doing.

Likewise, our prayers are the work of our ministry. If you say your prayers are with someone, and you follow through by actually praying for them, you're putting yourself in a place to see beyond your own world view, your own needs, you are walking in someone else's shoes, you are walking beside others in their needs.

These prayers deepen our empathy and put us in a place where God can change us and lead us to some action we can take. In your praying, you are speaking to God on their behalf, seeking God's grace for them at a time when they may be so wounded they can't pray for themselves.

Paul advised the early Christians to Be alert and disciplined so that you can pray. Love each other deeply, offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. – 1 Peter 4

If you have a relationship with God, then prayer is a ministry action in that relationship. It may not always seem a decisive action, but it is an alert, mindful, discipline that brings a new purpose and new blessing to the situation, a gift we are presenting to the ones for whom we are praying. Our prayer ministry to them is asking for God's help. What greater source of help can we offer?






Womens Bible Study (Fellowship Hall) Mondays at 1:00pm


