October's Focus on Missions and Outreach Shares "The Long Reach of Hospitality"

The theme of hospitality is found throughout our Bible, and when the Bible speaks of hospitality, it almost always ties it to strangers—people who aren't like us. Biblical hospitality means to give loving welcome to those outside your normal circle. Hebrews 13:2 teaches, "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it."

At its root, hospitality comes down to a simple truth: Because God is hospitable to us – even when we are living apart from God, God invites us into his presence. Christians demonstrate that we truly appreciate the Divine hospitality we have received when we extend hospitality to others.

God's Divine Hospitality is found throughout our Bible – from the Book of Genesis' telling of God's creative genius and beautiful hospitality of welcoming humanity into the garden and inviting, "You may eat freely of the fruit of every three in the garden (except the tree of knowledge of good and evil), to Revelation's themes of acts of hospitality reflecting God's love and grace extended both to the community of faith and to strangers.

From the Book of Genesis and the story of Abraham we can extract five principles for extending Christian hospitality, both celebrated within the community of faith and shared with strangers. From a reading of Genesis 18:

Principle One – Abraham was eager to practice hospitality. We all know people who love to offer hospitality. Others of us struggle with it, but hospitality is something we are all called to share. Again, our theme passage for our series is Romans is the command for Christ's Church and every person in it to use your gifts for ministry and "Be eager to practice hospitality."

Principle Two – It is Abraham's choice to offer hospitality. The three strangers did not ask for anything. They are simply standing there, giving Abraham the freedom to invite, or to ignore them. Christian hospitality is not to be shared out of guilt or fear. We practice true hospitality when we give from a freedom to choose. That is where the act becomes a blessing – a blessing to the one who receives ... and a blessing to the one who shares.

Principal Three – Abraham's hospitality has no strings attached. I recently shared a memory from way back in 1973 – when I was 13 years old – that made an impression on me for now 52 years. Briefly, a dinner guest, named Dr. Bouquet, who was a stranger to

me shared these words I still recall: "It is a good day when you see something beautiful; say something nice; and do something for someone who didn't expect it, and without the expectation of receiving anything in return."

Principle 4 – Hospitality can be disruptive.

Abraham is sitting in the shade of the flap of his tent in the heat of the day. He had probably been out in the field all morning, and now he was taking a breather. And then he sees these three people, standing there. He hadn't invited them. He didn't know them. He probably already had plans for his afternoon. I imagine the main reason people don't go out of their way to offer hospitality to others in need is because it will be disruptive of my plans.

Principle 5 – True hospitality honors your guests. Abraham honors his guests. He goes far beyond what would have been expected. He runs to greet them, provides fresh bread and serves the best choice of meat and then he stands to wait on them while they eat. Abraham treats these strangers as though they were sent from God. Reading further in Genesis 18, the three strangers are messengers of God. In our NT, the Book of Hebrews tells us that when we show hospitality to strangers, we may without realizing it, be showing hospitality to messengers of God.

Jesus teaches a similar lesson in Matthew 25 (34-40), teaching by illustration that the person who welcomes the stranger, welcomes Jesus. Abraham simply welcomed and served these strangers, as Dr. Bouquet taught me more than 50 years ago: Do something for someone without expecting anything in return and it will be a good day. Meaning, it will be your good blessing.


FAITH FOR THE CURIOUS
